Bagger Survey by RMC



The Rourkela Municipal Corporation is conducting a survey all beggar in the Rourkela Municipal Corporation area. All the Community Organizer, Social Welfare staffs are engaged in ward wise and sector wise to complete the survey. They have thoroughly made contact with slums, bastis and have identified that 423 nos. of baggers are identified. A plan of action shall be prepared for rehabilitation of beggar at Rourkela.

Commencement of Mobile Health Unit (MHU) in Rourkela Urban in PPP Mode



With the partnership of NGO- Gopinath Juba Sangha the Mobile Health Unit was started in Rourkela urban under NUHM, Rourkela with a formal inauguration and Flag off by SDMO cum Nodal Officer, NUHM, Rourkela. The micro plan is chalked out regarding the visit of MHU in the city in both Morning and Evening hours. The objective of the MHU is to address the health issues of the vulnerable groups, especially the mobile population by providing preventive, promotive and curative health care services at their doorsteps on routine manner and thereby creating an enabling

environment through awareness generation for improved health seeking behavior towards public health. The major thrust area of the MHU will be consultation, screening and referral. The different services to be provided are: General Service, RMNCH+A Service, Family Planning Service, Non Communicable Disease, Various Disease Control Programme, Diagnosis, IEC/BCC and Counseling etc.

Jala Chhatra initiatives by MAS at Pradhanpali S/c
